# COVID-19 CONTACT TRACING AND QUARANTINE GUIDELINES Ref No 31/F2/2020/H&FW dated 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2020

In superseding all the previous advisories, guidelines regarding the contact tracing and quarantine, the revised guidelines for contact tracing and quarantine are issued for implementation in the State of Kerala.

#### PART-I

#### **DEFINITION AND CLASSIFICATION OF COVID CONTACTS**

**Contact**: The World Health Organization(WHO), defines contact as:

Anyone with the following exposures to a COVID-19 case (alive or dead) from 2 days before to 14 days after the case's onset of illness. If confirmed cases are asymptomatic, contacts should be managed in the same way as for a symptomatic case with an exposure period from 2 days before the case was sampled, to 14 days after.

CONTACT	DESCRIPTION	
High Risk Contact	<ol> <li>Shared space within 1 metre of a COVID-19 case for &gt;15 minutes</li> <li>Direct physical contact with a COVID-19 case</li> <li>Direct care for patients with COVID-19 without using proper personal protective equipment (PPE)</li> <li>A person living in the household of a confirmed case</li> <li>Sharing a room, meal, or other space with a confirmed</li> </ol>	
	<ul> <li>patient</li> <li>Touched or cleaned the linens, clothes or dishes of the patient without wearing mask and not practicing hand hygiene</li> <li>Other patients# hospitalized in the same room or sharing the same bathroom as a COVID-19 patient or visitors to the patient</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>8. Health care workers# who have cared for the COVID cases / handled samples without adequate PPE or breach of PPE</li> <li>9. Health care worker who has performed an aerosol generating procedure without any of the following: Face shield, N95 mask, Gloves or had contact of body fluids on non-intact skin or mucous membranes</li> <li>10. Travel (any mode) in the same environment within one metre of a lab confirmed case</li> </ul>
Low Risk Contact	<ol> <li>Other persons who have shared the same time and space with the confirmed case and not having high risk contact</li> <li>Travelled in the same environment (any mode of transport) but not having high risk as above</li> <li>High risk contacts falling in points 1,2,6,10 who have taken adequate COVID precautions like wearing a three layer mask/N95 mask, practiced frequent hand hygiene and did not have other high risk contacts as mentioned above</li> </ol>

<sup>\*</sup>In situations where it is difficult to classify the exposure, a detailed exposure history should be taken and classification done on a case to case basis.

### **QUARANTINE / ISOALTION GUIDELINES**

GROUP	DESCRIPTION	QUARANTINE/ISOLATION
1	Laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19	Avoid non-essential travel and social contact for 7 days after discharge based on discharge criteria.
2	High Risk Primary Contact	14 days quarantine room quarantine at home or institution*
		If any symptoms develop during this period, even if mild, should be reported to DISHA 1056/ Local Public Health Authority

<sup>#</sup> Patients and health care workers becoming confirmed cases should be investigated on a case to case basis. A detailed contact history and contact tracing should be done to identify patients and health care workers exposed in wards, rooms, ICUs, bathrooms and other facilities in the hospital.

3	Low Risk Primary Contact	Avoid all non-essential travel and practice strict adherence to mask use, practice personal, cough, sneeze and hand hygiene.  Avoid community/social contact like attend marriages/functions/work/family visits etc  If any symptoms develop during this period, even if mild, should be reported to DISHA 1056/ Local Public Health Authority  The symptomatic person to be tested for COVID-19 (refer group 6)
4	A.Asymptomatic Secondary contact  B. Local contacts of people coming from country/area with community/local transmission	Practice strict adherence to mask use, practice personal, cough, sneeze and hand hygiene. Avoid close contact with community/social contact.  Practice social distancing at all times. Inform the employer/head of institution and may work at home or at the office using all the COVID safety precautions
		If any symptoms develop during this period, even if mild, should be reported to DISHA 1056/ Local Public Health Authority  The symptomatic person to be tested for COVID-19 (refer group 6)
5	Interstate Travellers & International Travellers coming from outside Kerala	14 days quarantine at home or institution*  If any symptoms develop during this period, even if mild, should be reported to DISHA 1056/ Local Public Health Authority  The symptomatic person to be tested
7	Health care worker with contact with a confirmed case with breach in PPE.	for COVID-19 (refer group 6)  14 days quarantine at home or institution*

8.	Any person (Not a Contact/ COVID Suspect/ Traveller) with Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI) or Influenza like Illness (ILI)	Seek health care through telemedicine or contact local health care provider / family doctor Get tested for COVID-19 if required (ILI)
		Undergo isolation at home/hospital till resolution of symptoms
		Get evaluated for other causes of ARI/ILI if required
9	Guest Workers coming for special projects through contractors or employees	As per the G.O
10	Business trip / Short Visits for travellers from other states  Return within 7 days of arrival in state with special pass	As per the G.O (Rt) No. 1880/2020/GAD dated 14.06.2020
11	Special situations (Citizens from outside country for Exams)	

For health care workers with high risk exposure, duration of quarantine can be individualized by the institutional medical boards based on the risk of exposure, test results, patient care location etc.
